Open Educational Resources

Any kind of teaching materials – textbooks, syllabi, lesson plans, videos, readings, exams

Open Educational Resources

Teaching, learning and research materials in any medium that reside in the public domain or have been released under an open license that permits no-cost access, use, adaptation and redistribution by others.

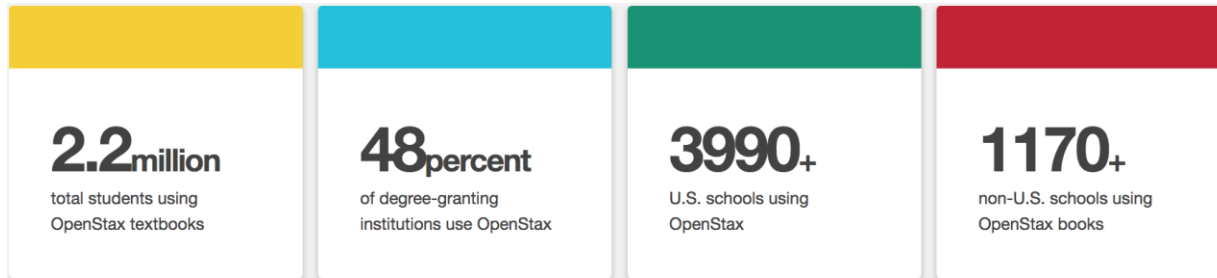

increase **equity**

All students have access to high quality learning materials that have the most **up-to-date and relevant content** because OER can be freely copied, modified and distributed to anyone.



Since 2012, OpenStax textbooks have saved 6.2 million students over US\$576M.

In 2019 alone, 2.2 million students are using OpenStax books and saving over US\$176M.

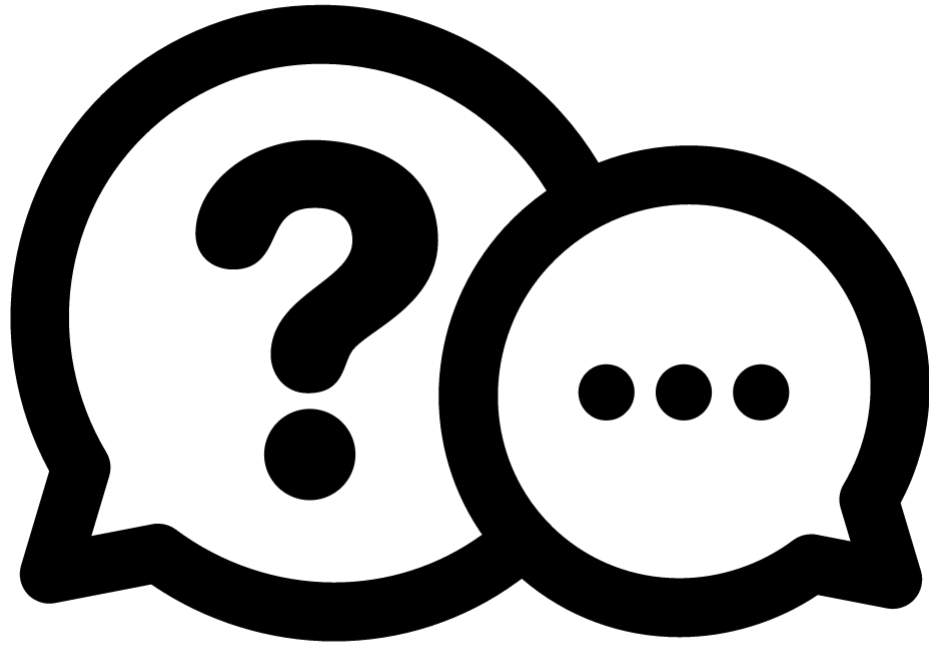

- Share what you own.



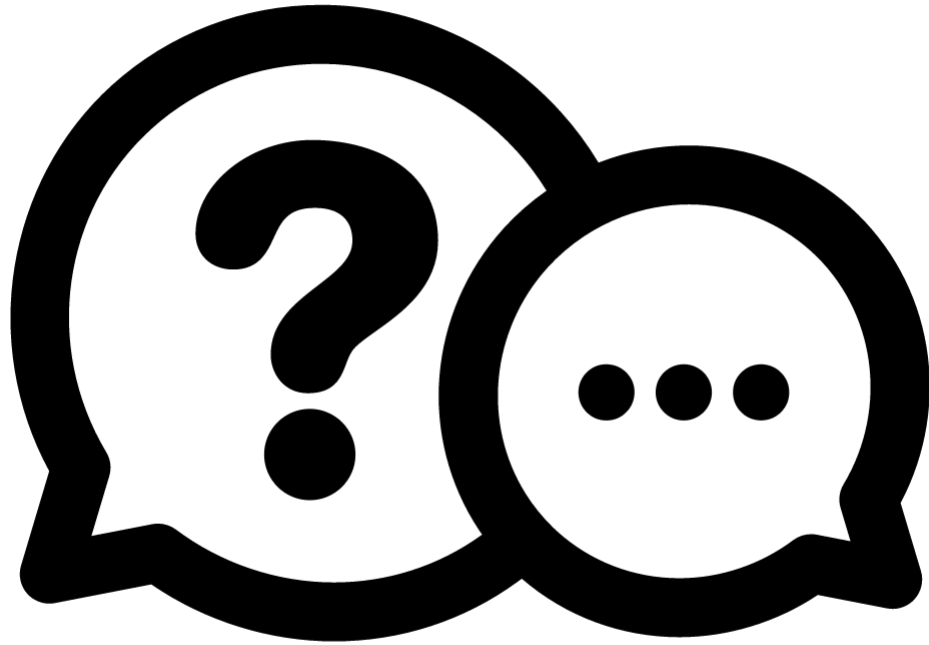

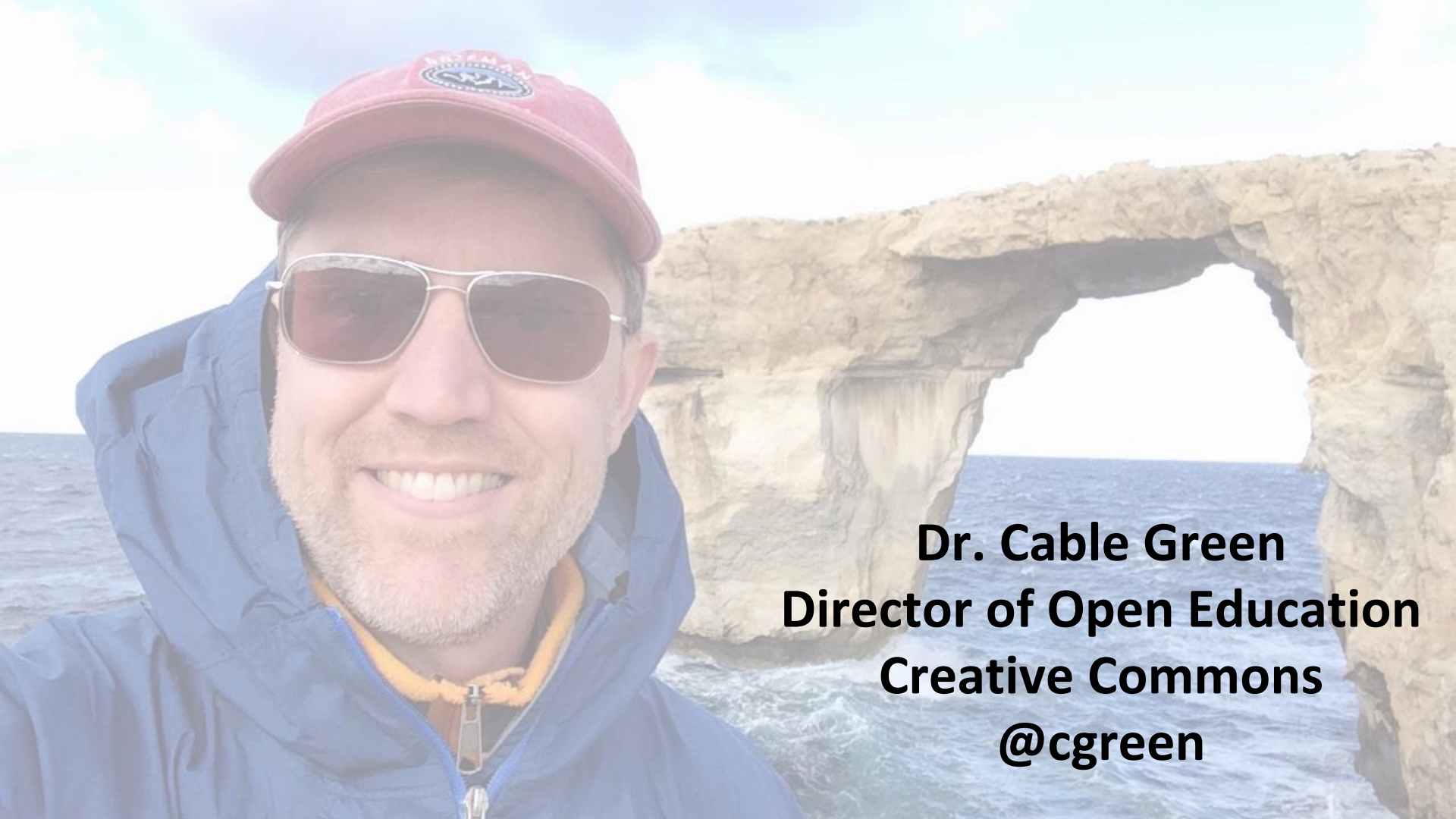
